# **MEMO**

Subject: Buildings and Grounds Committee Meeting

Date: February 24, 2020

The Buildings and Grounds Committee is scheduled to meet at 3:30pm on Thursday February 27, 2020 in the Parks and Recreation Conference Room, 107 N. Kent St, Winchester, VA. Items for discussion include:

## Items Requiring Action:

1. Bowman Lake Trail Funding:

Pine Knoll Construction provided the lowest responsive bid to complete the Bowman Lake Trail project for: \$108,075.58. Staff is seeing a funding request recommendation to the Parks and Recreation Commission for the bid price plus a 10% contingency: \$118,883. Any remaining funds will be returned upon project completion. Trail layout is attached for reference (Attachment 1).

2. Old Charlestown Road Park (Snowden Bridge) Master Plan:

After receiving public input staff is recommending changes to the draft plan previously presented to replace the southern rectangular field with hard surface play courts. Hard surface play courts for basketball, pickleball, and futsal would broaden the appeal of the park to a wider demographic of users and season of use. Staff is seeking a recommendation to the Parks and Recreation Commission for any plan modifications. If modifications are recommended and accepted by the Commission, staff would update the Master Plan for final approval. The draft plan and public input comments are attached for reference (Attachment 2).

3. AARP Grant Application:


Staff has identified a grant opportunity through AARP (American Association of Retired Persons) and is seeking a recommendation to pursue the grant. The AARP Community Grants program provides funding for recreation projects throughout the country. Projects are funded up to 100% by AARP and no matching funds are requested at this time. Applications are due April 1. Staff has identified a potential project in providing outdoor fitness equipment at Clearbrook Park and is working with a vendor to get an estimate of cost for 2-4 pieces of equipment emphasizing flexibility and range of motion. The AARP

Community Challenge grant program funded \$1.6 million in projects throughout the USA in 2019 with an average award amount of \$10,000.

#### Snowden Bridge Park Concept Plan Input: Online and at Public Input Session Comments:

Build an ice rink, Hagerstown's complex runs in the black every year!

I love this idea. We need a nice park. This area is growing

This would be in my backyard and I'm not in favor of a football field directly behind my home. I was told the only thing that might go behind my home was a small park not a football field. I am against this.

I just dont want big lights behind my house on Splendor Garden Way

Another pool would be nice. Our community is already overcrowded and with more people coming into the neighborhood, people will continue to be turned away at the existing pool. Thank you for your time.

I feel that the football field is too close to the backyards of the houses on prickly pear. Could cause incidental damages and invade privacy slightly. Other than that looks wonderful. Thank you.

Good evening, My name is Cord Culver and I am a homeowner on Pinwheel Court in Snowden Bridge. There are several issues of concern regarding the proposed sports park being built adjacent to Snowden Bridge; the first being the walking path. The walking path connecting to the Pinwheel Court cul-de-sac invites non-residents to begin parking in the already limited available spaces of our residential streets. In turn, that leads to a direct increase in foot traffic. There is a concern that increasing the number of non-residents passing through our direct residential area makes residences along Pinwheel and parallel blocks more susceptible to litter, vandalism and theft, especially during the hours from dusk through dark. Secondly, residents are concerned about the noise from the fields. There is a concern that the noise from games, events, and pedestrians, during both early mornings and later evenings, will have a disruptive effect on the neighborhood. Many of the homes on Pinwheel Court, and nearby streets, have small children with earlier bedtimes and residents do not wish to contend with the noise of the events or pedestrians when it comes to getting their children to bed, nor do they wish to be disrupted by early attendees. The proposed layout of the fields, as they are currently written, and their direct negative impact on what is a quiet, peaceful, and safe neighborhood, is unsatisfactory, and unwelcome. Thank you for your time, What about a football field?? No where in any of our parks do we have a football field. Did you know we have an amazing go youth travel football team here in town who could really use a nice field to play on

What is the possible timeline of this project?

One less multipurpose field and one pool needed

This seems to be a good use of the space for public use. The entrance should remain on Old Charlestown Road as to not impact traffic through Snowden Bridge. My only other comment is to not install large lights, or limit to only one field with the least impact to the surrounding community.

Also, when will these pedestrian trails in Snowden Bridge be completed? The developer has yet to develop the roadways for the residents, for example--refusing to open Snowden Bridge Blvd so people could use the traffic light on Rt. 11. It is worrisome that the developer is in no hurry to provide the expected infrastructure. Thank you.

Also why is there a plan to provide access from the end of Pinwheel Ct to the new park? This park has nothing to do with the Snowden Bridge subdivision. Access would only increase traffic on an already narrow and crowded street as people would attempt to park there to avoid traffic entering and exiting on Old Charles Town Road. I believe that active outdoor recreation purposes is not appropriate for the area considering how small the parcel is and how it is literally surrounded by existing residential homes. #### To whom it may concern:

I wanted to voice my concerns for the concept plan for the parkland near the Snowden Bridge development along Old Charles Town road. I believe the plan overlooks the safety and privacy of Snowden Bridge residence and this is where I find fault in it. I want to suggest two changes to the proposal.

Like Clearbrook park, there should be a perimeter fence around the property where locked gates are at the entrance to the parking lot and at the various access point along the path. Naturally, these gates can be opened during daylight hours while the park is open. While there is no community around Clearbrook, it is secure all around. This park proposal need to take in consideration that it has a young community surrounding it and the safety of the children should be at the forefront of what I expect from our local government. We live next to the I-81 corridor and we should never turn a blind eye that human trafficking is prevalent in this county. Also, the houses immediately bordering the park are at the most risk of vandalism and this park will open up access to this. I would also like to see security cameras in the parking lot. Security cameras are everywhere, they are cheaper and better today then they have ever been, and there should be no reason that they are not installed at all of our parks across the county. Especially, a newly built one.

I would also like the plan to consider the privacy of the homes surrounding the park. I believe there should be both a visual and sound barrier between the residences and the playing fields. Keeping the tree line along the Prickley Pear line is a free natural barrier that is cost effective. Adding privacy evergreens between the Splendor Garden homes would also create a natural barrier. Having such natural landscaping I believe is a must to any park. There would need to be a change the concept plan to do this. The location of the football field or the elimination of the football field and a change of the proposal to another size field or court.

Finally, these fields are all dedicated to a younger population and discriminate against many who can not run long distances. I believe there could be change to one of the soccer fields into a football field and putting in some pickle ball, tennis, volleyball, or basketball courts where the football field is proposed would bring a more diverse age population to the park, ultimately creating a safer environment due to more adult eyes watching what is going on.

Re: 25 Acre park to be established adjacent to Snowden Bridge Community

I recently attended the informational meeting on January 28,2020 held at Stonewall Elementary School.

I thought those representing the department were very pleasant and tried to answer questions and address concerns to the best of their knowledge. I also agree that nice parks and athletic facilities can be a welcome addition to a community. My concern, however, is the proximity of this facility, more specifically, the location of the proposed football field and it's proximity to those of us in the Snowden Bridge community who border the park.

My husband and I bought and built our home a little over 4 years ago. We live on Dutchman Ct., which is one street over from Pinwheel Ct...see the map. We chose our lot for several reasons..it was at the end of the cul de sac, we had neighbors on only one side, no one across from us in the cul de sac, and at the time, only nice woods to the left of our home. I could look out front windows and side windows and see a peaceful setting. In time, things began to change as townhouses were built across from us, but we have become used to that. And in the summer the leafed out trees have obscured their view. But this new development of this park and the football field has left me feeling quite upset. I feel things will change drastically if this goes through. We bought this house thinking this would be our 'forever" home as we are in our 70's now. But the thought of noise, lights, increased foot traffic, if an access path is built from Pinwheel, leaves me wondering what to do. It does not seem right that those who currently live here and have invested a fair amount of money in to their homes and most likely chose that location for asthetic reasons, suddenly face the prospect of a drastic change that will negatively impact us. I am hoping that these concerns will be taken in to consideration, not only for the single family homeowners who will border the park, but also for the townhouse homeowners who will have the field right out their back door.

Thank you for the opportunity to express how I feel..unfortunately I don't think this letter truly expresses the stress I am experiencing.
