Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)

The TANF program provides a temporary, monthly cash payment to families with eligible children living in their home to help meet their basic needs.



Who is eligible?

Households with eligible children. Eligible children must be:



- » Under the age of 18
 - or if 18 years old, they must be enrolled and attending a secondary school or vocational/ technical school of secondary equivalency and meeting the enrollment and attendance requirements as determined by the local school board.



» Living in the home of a parent or other relative, or is in foster care (under certain conditions).



» A Virginia resident.



- » A U.S. citizen or eligible immigrant.
- » Part of a family in need of financial assistance.

What assistance programs fall under TANF?

THE VIRGINIA INITIATIVE FOR EDUCATION AND WORK (VIEW)

program promotes economic independence through participation in employment-related activities, education, training and supportive services to enable families with eligible children to become self-sufficient.

THE TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES - UNEMPLOYED PARENT (TANF-UP)

program helps families with two able-bodied parents in the household.

DIVERSIONARY ASSISTANCE

benefits help prevent potential TANF recipients from becoming ongoing TANF recipients.

THE FULL EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM (FEP)

is a subsidized employment program designed to help VIEW participants become more self-sufficient by earning a living wage and increasing work skills.

EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE

may be provided to needy families with children who are eligible for, or are receiving, TANF when the family has an immediate need resulting from a natural disaster or fire, or to assist with eviction prevention.
